


### Greetings

#### AI - Impacts on work environment and recruiting habits





According to a McKinsey study, by 2030, activities that account for up to 30 percent of hours currently worked across the US economy could be automated - a trend accelerated by generative AI. However, the analysts see Generative AI enhancing the way STEM, creative as well as business and legal professionals work rather than eliminating a significant number of jobs outright.
